

From the Study Luke 2:6-18 (The Message)

6-7 While they were there, the time came for her to give birth. She gave birth to a son, her firstborn. She wrapped him in a blanket and laid him in a manger, because there was no room in the hostel.

8-12 There were shepherds camping in the neighborhood. They had set night watches over their sheep. Suddenly, God's angel stood among them and God's glory blazed around them. They were terrified. The angel said, "Don't be afraid. I'm here to announce a great and joyful event that is meant for everybody, worldwide: A Savior has just been born in David's town, a Savior who is Messiah and Master. This is what you're to look for: a baby wrapped in a blanket and lying in a manger."

13-14 At once the angel was joined by a huge angelic choir singing God's praises: Glory to God in the heavenly heights,

Peace to all men and women on earth who please him.

15-18 As the angel choir withdrew into heaven, the shepherds talked it over. "Let's get over to Bethlehem as fast as we can and see for ourselves what God has revealed to us." They left, running, and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in the manger. Seeing was believing. They told everyone they met what the angels had said about this child. All who heard the shepherds were impressed.

It doesn't matter which translation I read of the Bible, in this passage from Luke's gospel I can't help seeing the excitement of the shepherds after they had that visit from the angels, "Let's get over to Bethlehem as fast as we can and see for ourselves what God has revealed to us."

My question is this, 'How excited are you about this?' I know some people don't get excited about Christmas, I understand that; but it's not just Christmas, it's about Jesus. How excited are you that God would be willing to come into this world in the form of a human baby?

I read that 10% of people in Wales think about the birth of Christ in their Christmas preparations. I don't know if that's true, however, I am concerned

whether Christians are excited about Jesus in their daily lives, not just at Christmas. Perhaps we could all learn a lesson from those shepherds - "Let's get over to Bethlehem as fast as we can and see for ourselves what God has revealed to us." Christmas

Can we be better at caring for creation and each other through healthy, eco-friendly and sustainable choices at Christmas?

Here's some suggestions to help us think before we buy:

- 1. Go for a natural wreath and decorations. Holly sprigs, ivy trails, pinecones, rose hips, and other greenery rather than shiny tinsel and plastic.
- 2. Avoid buying wrapping paper (and cards) that have glitter and/ or shiny bits as they cannot be recycled after you use them.
- Quality not quantity: Around half of UK adults say they have received gifts they don't want at Christmas. When buying gifts think less but better, putting the time into picking a quality item that will last a longer.
- 4. Give the gift of time itself. What about a gift of cooking for someone once a month for a year, taking them for a coffee, babysitting, house cleaning... Just make a 'gift of time gift voucher' and put it in a card for them.
- Think about materials: Ensure wood and paper gifts are made from recycled or (FSC) certified materials. Avoid single-use plastic items that can't be recycled and items such as single-use tablecloths and napkins.
- Look for things like Fairtrade or Organic-certified food and clothing. Vintage clothes and home furnishings, and refurbished technology can make great sustainable gifts.
- Try to better plan your food shopping so that you don't waste un-eaten food. Freeze any leftovers or food items before they go past their best to gain some extra time.
- 8. Use LED lights on your Christmas tree and around the house. They use less energy, last longer and look just as good! Also, switch off your lights at night - it's safer and won't cost the earth.
- 9. Reduce waste even further by buying gifts with little or no packaging. If you must use packaging, use recycled, or recyclable, materials.
- 10. Many Christmas crackers are not recyclable, and the toys inside are often made of plastic. Instead, look out for FSC-certified crackers. Reusable DIY crackers are another great option. Fill them yourself with sustainable options (like chocolates) and personalised festive favours.

Two very different angles for thought and action this month: $\underline{COP28}\dots$

... is the United Nations Climate Change Conference taking place in Dubai, United Arab Emirates, from 30 November until 12 December 2023.

Here's a little more information about it so that we can pray about it and maybe even for specific topics on the specific days they will be discussed.

What is COP28?

Officially, COP 28 stands for the 28th meeting of the Conference of the Parties (COP) to the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC). To put it simply, it is where the world comes together to agree on ways to address the climate crisis, such as limiting global temperature rise to 1.5 degrees Celsius, helping vulnerable communities adapt to the effects of climate change, and achieving net-zero emissions by 2050.

More than 70,000 delegates are expected to attend, including the member states (or Parties). Business leaders, young people, climate scientists, Indigenous Peoples, journalists, and various other experts and stakeholders will also be there.

Why is it so important?

With the most important details of the Paris Climate Change Agreement negotiated and agreed over the last few years, COP 28 is all about implementing the Agreement and ramping up ambition and action.

We are in a decisive decade for climate action.

What are the topics under discussion and when?

Sunday 3rd December- Health/relief, recovery and peace

Mon 4th - Finance/trade/gender equality/accountability

Tues 5th - Energy, industry, and just transition

Wed 6th- Multilevel action, urbanization and built environment/transport

Fri 8th - Youth, children, education and skills

Sat 9th- Nature, land use, and oceans

Sunday 10th - Food, agriculture and water
