

From the Study Exodus 3:12-15 (NIVUK)

¹² And God said, "I will be with you. And this will be the sign to you that it is I who have sent you: When you have brought

the people out of Egypt, you will worship God on this mountain."

¹³ Moses said to God, "Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' Then what shall I tell them?"

¹⁴ God said to Moses, "I am who I am. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I am has sent me to you."

¹⁵ God also said to Moses, "Say to the Israelites, 'The Lord, the God of your fathers—the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob—has sent me to you.'

"This is my name forever, the name you shall call me from generation to generation.

Jesus asked His disciples, "Who do you say I am?" Moses asked the Lord God, "Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' Then what shall I tell them?"

I was wondering (and I'm going to look at this more during our evening service on the 18th February), if someone were to ask you, 'Who is God?' or, 'Who is Jesus?' What would you tell them?

These are important questions, because even many Christians have strange ideas of who God is for them. Some talk about God as if they were talking about a friend they drink with at the local pub. David Pawson once described some Christians as forgetting who God really is, stating, 'They seem to worship God *all matey* rather than *God Almighty*.'

Can I encourage you to ask this question - 'Is God real to you?'


From the Study (Continued)

My reason is genuine because, many people don't seem to behave as though God is real. It's almost as though He's something we pull out of the closet on a Sunday, then pack Him away again after that hour in church.

Jesus asked His disciples, "Who do you say I am?" Peter answered, "You are the Christ / Messiah, Son of the living God." We have been saved by a living Saviour to serve and worship a living God, who gives us His living Holy Spirit to live in us.

If someone asks you, 'Who is God?' or, 'Who is Jesus?' you need to know how to respond, there's no option to 'phone a friend' or 'ask the audience'; if you know God is alive, that He lives in you, then trust the Holy Spirit to give you the answer – tell those who ask who God is in you, who Jesus is and what he has done for you.

Lent Vigil for our planet

From the 14th until 24th February, Christians will be gathering in Westminster for 24/7 prayer - bearing witness to the impacts of climate breakdown and praying for our world.

This Lent Vigil is being organised by a coalition of Christian organisations - Christian Climate Action, Tearfund, Christian Aid, CAFOD, Green Christian, Operation Noah, the Salvation Army and A Rocha UK.

<u>Together we will pray for creation, for our global neighbours</u> <u>and for bold climate action from the UK Government.</u>

Prayer is powerful. It can bring transformation, even in the midst of injustice.

Lent offers us a season both to lament the failure to address the climate crisis and the hope of change as we approach the resurrection transformation of Easter.

Whilst most of us can't get to London, there are also ways to pray remotely! You can download the <u>Vigil from home</u> resource sheet to use for yourself to spend time in prayer at home or we can do it as a church. The sheet explains why climate justice is important and why we need action from the UK government. It suggests bible readings and prayers and talking points.
